1. The district is moving forward with the roll out of ParentSquare. https://www.parentsquare.com/ This will eventually replace remind App and other apps used for communication. This will also help with the goal of community outreach. There will be a student, parent, and teacher view in the application. As a parent of multiple children, you will have one site for access for all your kids. There is also a translation function that would allow communication to be seen in different languages.
2. The district is in the process of updating their phone system. There will now be an additional single fiber connection going into each school. This will take away the current single point of failure for our phone systems. In the future you will no longer have district wide outages of phones but will only have a single building or school. The district is also moving to Microsoft teams for their phone system. Teachers will have the ability to make calls from anywhere
on any of their devices. There are a few different phone types that will be distributed out.
3. The IT department will begin to survey all wireless internet access in all the district's buildings. This will help identify spots that do not have wireless access and will be able to remediate. The goal will be to have full coverage of wireless in all their buildings.
